Guidelines: Osher Reentry Scholarship

The School of Continuing Studies is pleased to announce the Osher Reentry Scholarship for degreeseeking undergraduate students. The Osher Reentry Scholarship program is made possible by The Bernard Osher Foundation and is made available to both new and continuing students who meet the described criteria and demonstrate both strong academic achievement and financial need. The maximum annual award toward tuition will be \$4,290 (3 courses).

Preferred applicants are between the ages of 25 and 50 and must have reentered higher education after a five or more year interruption in their education since their last enrollment at an institution of higher education.

Osher Reentry Scholars will be paired with an experienced SCS student, who will serve as mentor throughout the year. Osher Reentry Scholars will have identified opportunities to meet with other Osher Scholars. The designation as Osher Reentry Scholar, assuming continual good academic standing, will become part of the scholar's permanent record.

Deadlines*

Deadlines for application for this scholarship are as follows:

Fall quarter: September 1Spring Quarter: March 1Winter quarter: December 1Summer session: June 1*Because of the structure of the Osher funding, SCS will be limited to approximately 18 awards per
year; funds may be exhausted by the end of Fall Quarter.

Eligibility

New and continuing SCS students are eligible. Applicants must meet the following criteria:

- Preferably be between the ages of 25-50
- Be pursuing their first baccalaureate degree
- Have or have had a five or more year gap in their attendance at an institution of higher education
- Current undergraduate students must have a 3.00 or higher GPA and a 3.0 GPA at most recent institution if the applicant is a first quarter PBA or transfer student
- New PBA or transfer students must have had a 3.0 or higher GPA at the last institution attended.
- Complete a one-page application
- Submit two references, one academic/professional and one community organization
- Submit an essay describing academic and professional goals and how funds would support the initiatives. Include an additional description of how a mentor relationship with a current student would impact the applicant's learning experience and what the applicant would seek to gain from this relationship.
- Complete the FAFSA and University aid applications to demonstrate financial need
