

Examity Flag Breakdown

When it's time for you to review exams, we know that simpler is better. That's why Examity uses four distinctly colored flags to clearly identify any violations or technical issues that occurred during a proctoring session. But, what do the different categories mean, and what are they typically referencing?

In order to better understand, here is a breakdown of each category, including descriptions and helpful examples.



Green Flags - No Violation

Green flags note that significant steps in the proctoring process were completed successfully.

Green Flag Category	Examples
Authentication completed	Test-taker successfuly performed all three levels of authentication without incident
Exam completed with no violations	Exam was completed and submitted successfully, and no red flags were raised



Yellow Flags - Potential Violation

Yellow flags are issued when a rule is broken but cheating is not apparent.

Yellow Flag Category	Examples
Leaves test area	 Abandoning the test area to retrieve or adjust something in the room (i.e. getting writing utensil, shutting door, etc.) Bathroom break (even if allowed in additional rules)
Pre/Post instructions not followed	 Desk or surrounding area is not clear Full room pan was not submitted Special instructions were not adhered to
Speaking aloud or to another person	 Reading questions aloud Interacting with someone other than proctor in the room
Suspicious eye/head movement	 Moving partially out of webcam frame during exam Exhibiting frequent or prolonged suspicious eye and/or head movement
Taking exam in public/non-private area	 A person enters or walks through the test area Exam room is in a public place in order to access internet
Other	 Background noise/audio Young children in the room with test-taker Additional time used



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Red Flags - Violation

Red flags are given when the test-taker exhibits clear cheating behavior.

Red Flag Category	Examples
Attempt to copy, paste or print questions/ answers	Attempts copy and paste functionality, printing of test questions, or the usage of snipping tool or screen grabs
Dual monitor use	Tries to utilize dual monitors
Exam-related conversation	Exam-related conversation via chat, email, or in-person
Internet search	Attempts to conduct internet searches to find answers
Unauthorized materials or devices	Seeks to use unauthorized devices (i.e phone), materials (i.e. scrap paper, reference materials, etc.) or computer
Other	 Proctor's requests ignored by test-taker Inappropriate/hostile behavior Other inappropriate or cheating behavior, as described in comments section



Blue Flags (or alerts) - Technical Issues

Blue flags are reported when a technical issue arises.

Blue Flag Category	Examples
Delay in screen-sharing or poor video/audio quality	 Delay in screenshare Poor sound quality throughout the test Blurry or grainy webcam
Disconnected from the session due to internet, webcam, or LMS	Received the messge "The connection was lost due to network fluctuation, slow internet, or server being busy" and lost the exam page and/or webcam
Testing platform or password issues	 Exam missing from test platform Exam password issue Issue with elelments of exam (i.e. audio)
Unable to upload exam file	Unable to upload exam file
Webcam, microphone, or connection issues	Audio lost during proctoring sessionWebcam video froze during exam session
Other	 Profile image did not import correctly Pop-ups repeatedly displayed during session
