Industrialization along the U.S.-Mexico

Much of the history of the U.S.-Mexico borderlands during the 20th century focuses on conflict caused by undocumented immigration. It is also important to consider how both countries cooperated and collaborated to solve mutual problems along their shared boundary. This talk details how President Gustavo Diaz Ordaz and President Lyndon Baines Johnson formed a bilateral agency to industrialize and improve the standard of living in the rural expanses of the U.S.-Mexico borderlands. The bilateral development plan provoked opposition from both conservative Republicans and liberal labor leaders. The U.S. Mexico border plan also impacted national political coalitions in the 1970s labor unions, which turned away from the Democratic Party to prevent the "exportation" of American jobs.



Sean Parulian Harvey is a doctoral candidate in history at Northwestern University. His dissertation is entitled "Assembly Lines: Maquiladoras and the Making of the U.S.-Mexico Borderlands." In this project, he traces the origins of maquiladoras, export-oriented assembly factories located along the U.S.-Mexico border, in the economic and environmental policies of the New Deal and Great Society.


