Summer Session 2020 and Fall Planning

As I mentioned last week, Northwestern University announced that all summer session classes that start on or before July 12 must be run remotely for the entire summer. Therefore, OLLI will run its study groups remotely this summer. The OLLI summer schedule is currently packed with remote study groups and enrichment events. A robust training schedule will be established to any who wish to participate in the summer session but are new to remote learning/Zoom.

OLLI will continue to be flexible in its planning for fall programming so that we can respond to whatever is thrown our way, whether that is a full return to campus, a modified return, or a remote-only semester. A decision on the plan for fall will be made no later than the end of June, if it is not already make for us by Northwestern University. Irrespective of the plan adopted, OLLI will continue to offer a robust and engaging selection of remote study groups, academic enrichment, and social opportunities.

Join us for this special online community forum to explore how collaboration among government, business, philanthropic organizations and community groups is guiding and reshaping city policies and priorities at this crucial time. We'll hear from Chicago community leaders on the front lines of driving change, and learn about new research from Northwestern University on

About OLLI Webinars

In lieu of in-person lectures, the OLLI spring lecture series will now be conducted as webinars. Webinars function slightly different from OLLI remote study group meetings. Here's how:

- Webinars are live lectures (not recorded), but attendees are not seen and their microphones are muted. Only the speaker and host are seen and heard.
- Attendees are able to ask the speaker questions using the Q & A text box at the bottom of their screen. The webinar host will read some of the questions out loud for the speaker to answer during the short Q & A session at the end of the presentation.

- Access is via a website link. Once registration is completed, all attendees will be emailed a link to access the lecture. Simply click on the link provided at webinar start time to join.
- Webinars are open to all current OLLI members. Registration is required. Remember, even if your spring study group was cancelled, you are still an OLLI member and our webinars are a benefit of that membership.


